



# Canada

From sea to sky, VANCOUVER delivers adventure in every direction. In Coal Harbour, yachts line the marina as seaplanes soar toward remote coastal inlets. False Creek Ferries cross to Granville Island, and shoppers seek out boutiques along downtown's Robson Street and 4th Avenue in Kitsilano. The Fairmont Pacific Rim and Fairmont Waterfront flank Canada Place, oozing panoramic views of luxury ships bound for Alaska. On the North Shore, hikers tackle the steep Grouse Grind or wander scenic paths through Lynn Canyon for a noteworthy perspective of Vancouver's wild terrain. Trails, bridges, and seawalls wind through Stanley Park (pictured), where the forest meets the harbor in the city's iconic green heart.

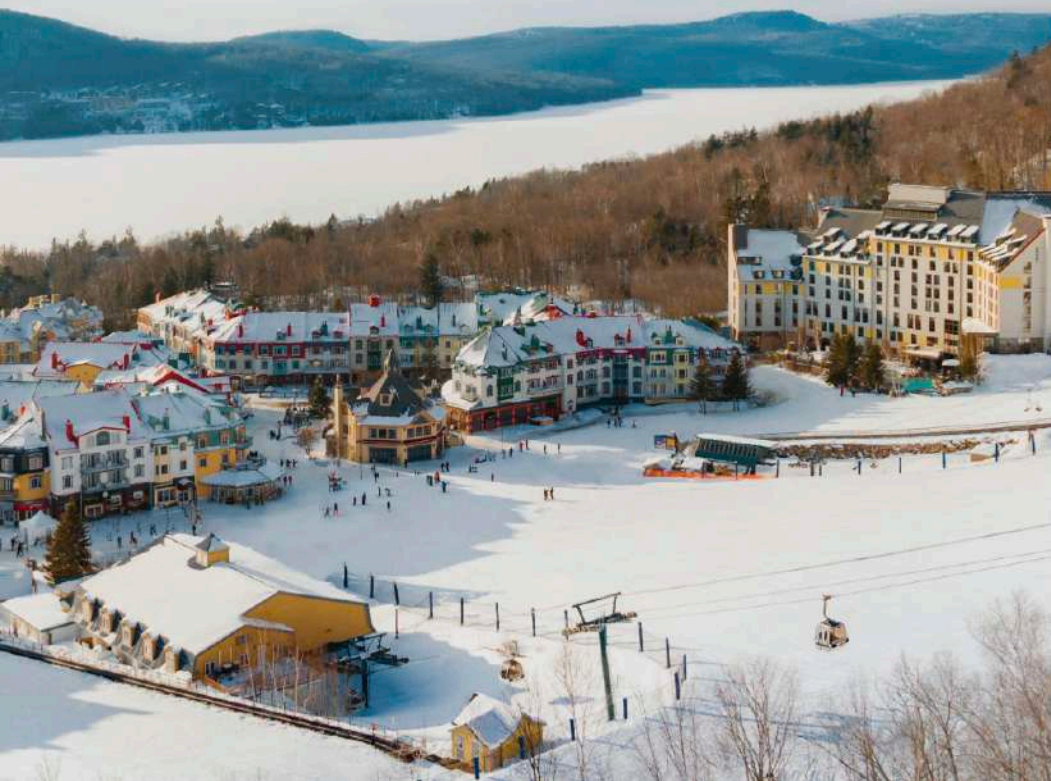


## POSTCARD FROM...

### Fairmont Tremblant

If you are looking for French-Canadian charm with a lively alpine spirit, Mont-Tremblant delivers it in every season. Just 90 minutes from Montréal, this colorful, European-style pedestrian village sits at the base of one of North America's top ski destinations. The newly renovated Fairmont Tremblant is the only true ski-in, ski-out property in the village, placing guests directly on the slopes from the hotel's terrace level, along with added amenities like ski butlers, a ski valet, and onsite ticket services. Many of the 312 rooms and suites feature views of the mountains or forest—especially striking during Quebec's fall foliage season (the region's dramatic autumn landscapes are considered some of the most beautiful in Canada). After a day outdoors, guests can enjoy a lively après-ski scene, soak in heated outdoor hydrotherapy pools year round, or gather under the stars for campfire nights.

## THE SOUL OF OLD QUEBEC

**Auberge Saint-Antoine** transforms history into hospitality in a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Auberge Saint-Antoine occupies a trio of historic buildings on Îlot Hunt, a UNESCO World Heritage Site layered with more than three centuries of lore. Every stay feels personal, as if you've been welcomed into a private home. The hotel itself becomes a gateway to exploring Old Quebec's romantic, European-inspired charm. Awarded two Michelin Keys and part of the Relais & Châteaux collection, the property's intimate scale (just 95 rooms) allows for exceptional attention to detail. Brass keys, clay pipes, and antique ceramics unearthed on-site during construction are thoughtfully displayed and folded into the present-day experience. A stay here is as much a taste of Quebec's terroir as it is a glimpse into its history. At the heart of the Auberge's culinary philosophy lies La Ferme du Coteau, the Price family's own organic farm on Île d'Orléans, where seasonal ingredients are grown exclusively for the hotel's restaurants—a connection that has made the Auberge a culinary destination as much as a luxury hotel.

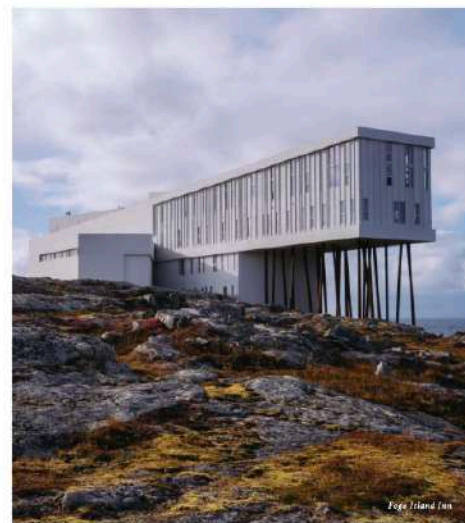

## EDGE OF THE WORLD

Dramatic landscapes surround **Fogo Island Inn**, with every stay sustaining the island's future.

The stark form of Fogo Island Inn hovers against a backdrop of North Atlantic waves and endless sky, its striking modern minimalist design echoing the saltbox houses of traditional fishing outposts. Light cascades across the white spruce exterior and in through the floor-to-ceiling windows, throwing pink sunsets, orange-hued mornings, and shades of amber across the property. Inside, the dining room mirrors the Inn's clean, contemporary lines, while handcrafted furniture, textiles, and quilts bring warmth and texture to every space (there are only 29 guest rooms and suites). The soul of the stilted Inn lies in its purpose. Founded by Shorefast, a charity created on Fogo Island, it operates as a community enterprise, reinvesting 100 percent of surpluses into sustaining the island's culture, economy, and environment. The perfect way to arrive? By private charter or helicopter, soaring over rugged cliffs and vast ocean before touching down on this edge-of-the-world escape.

### ◀◀ Sonora Resort

SONORA ISLAND, BRITISH COLUMBIA

Travelers arrive at Sonora Resort by sea or air, leaving behind roads, noise, and routine until only wilderness stretches ahead. Each day is full of encounters with wildlife, rugged landscapes, and untamed coastal waters. Pause on forest trails to hear nothing but wind through cedar and hemlock before returning to oceanfront suites with sweeping views of the Discovery Island archipelago and dinners inspired by the surrounding sea and forest.

**THE VIBE:** Post-and-beam design, floor-to-ceiling windows, and Relais & Châteaux luxury create a retreat where the boundaries between indoors and wilderness disappear.

**FOOD & DRINK:** Seasonal dishes in the Tye Dining Room—as eagles circle above and sea lions feast on migrating salmon—turn every meal into a connection with the wild.

**DON'T MISS:** Join Homalco First Nation guides to watch grizzlies fishing for salmon along remote riverbanks in their natural habitat.

### ►► Fairmont Banff Springs

BANFF, ALBERTA

Known as the “Castle in the Rockies,” Fairmont Banff Springs has been welcoming travelers to Banff National Park since 1888. Initially built by the Canadian Pacific Railway and later rebuilt with locally quarried Rundle limestone, the hotel combines castle-like architecture with its dramatic mountain setting. Turrets and stone walls rise sharply from the valley floor of this 739-room hotel, commanding views of snowcapped peaks and winding rivers.

**THE VIBE:** A mountain castle with stately presence and a heritage lodge’s warmth, deeply connected to its national park surroundings.

**FOOD & DRINK:** Afternoon Tea at Rundle Bar pairs delicate pastries and fine teas with sweeping views of Banff National Park and a signature gin cocktail infused with local botanicals.

**DON'T MISS:** Slip behind a hidden bookshelf in Rundle Bar to discover a speakeasy-style private room for intimate cocktails and late-night conversations.

### ►► Shangri-La Toronto

TORONTO, ONTARIO

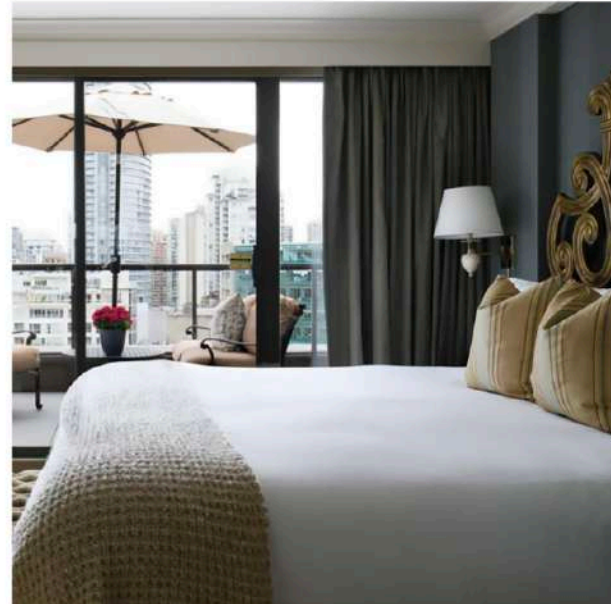
Rising 66 stories above University Avenue, this sleek, modern tower in Toronto’s downtown skyline fuses East-meets-West design in equal measure. Natural light pours through expansive windows draped in silk, and canopy beds are dressed in crisp white linens, offset by rich textures and polished dark wood paneling.

**THE VIBE:** Elegant with a cosmopolitan energy that attracts both business and leisure travelers, where art and atmosphere reflect the pulse of the city.

**FOOD & DRINK:** Often called Toronto’s urban living room, the Lobby Lounge is a see-and-be-seen destination for afternoon tea, craft cocktails, and Asian-inspired dishes. Each evening, music from a handcrafted Italian Fazioli piano drifts through the room, adding warmth and sophistication.

**DON'T MISS:** Unwind with a eucalyptus-scented private hammam ritual, then swim beneath the glass roof of a 65-foot lap pool framed by cascading water features.

VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA

Family-owned since 1984, the Wedgewood Hotel & Spa is a Relais & Châteaux property tucked beside Robson Square. Its 83 rooms and suites, all with private balconies, overlook the Vancouver Art Gallery or the city skyline, while antiques, family-collected art, and custom furnishings lean toward old-world elegance.

**THE VIBE:** The quiet elegance of a European drawing room transplanted into the heart of Vancouver strikes a balance between refined formality and the comfort of home.

**FOOD & DRINK:** Velvet armchairs, Murano glass fixtures, and Venetian-inspired details set the stage for European-infused West Coast cuisine at Michelin-Recommended Bacchus. The marinated and poached Nova Scotia lobster is not to be missed.

**DON'T MISS:** The Chelsea Patio becomes a hidden, open-air retreat, perfect for alfresco lunches and afternoon cocktails that feel like a secret garden.
